Korina Fraiman

Born in St. Petersburg (former USSR), immigrated to Israel with her family in 1990. She graduated from 'Bikurei Ha'itim' dance training, danced in the Kibbutz Dance Company, the Batsheva Dance Company and the Vertigo Dance Company. During her work in these companies, she participated in pieces by choreographers Rami Be'er, Idan Sharabi, Itzik Galili, Ohad Naharin, Sharon Eyal, Danielle Agami, Noa Wertheim, Bosmat Nosen, and Gil Karer.

Korina has been teaching Gaga since 2015 as well as the repertoire of the companies that she has danced for. She's certified as a therapist in both 'Shiatsu' and the 'Ilan Lev' methods. Korina serves as a teacher at the 'Vertigo Dancers Training Workshop', alongside teaching 'Gaga People' and the professional Gaga dancers (in 'Kameaa', 'Inbal' companies and more...). She continues to participate in independent projects with the choreographers Elad Schechter and Gil Karrer, alongside her participation in tours of Noa Wertheim's Vertigo Dance Company.

Ido Gidron

Born in Shoresh, a village near Jerusalem. He is a graduate of the Jerusalem high-school of the 'Academy of Music and Dance' and the 'Greenhouse' program for outstanding dancers in Batsheva.

Recipient of the IDF outstanding dancer award. Ido danced in the Kibbutz Contemporary Dance Company and in the Batsheva Dance Company. In 2017 he was invited as a guest dancer to the Oslo National Ballet. Ido participated in projects by choreographers Idan Sharabi, Maya Michlal Gelfand, Avihai Haham, and Sharon Vazzanna. He created a prize-winning Duet from the 'Machol Shalem' choreography competition which he presented in Berlin, Copenhagen, Rotterdam, the Canary Islands and Cyprus.

Ido is a Gaga teacher and teaches both in Israel and the USA, Canada, Germany, Italy, Netherlands, Cyprus and Serbia, including companies such as the Gothenburg Dance Company and the Toula Limnaios Company in Berlin. Ido taught at the residency program in Atlanta, Georgia, and created a dance piece in collaboration with the Israel Institute. Gidron is participating in the new Sidi Larbi Cherkaouii piece (Belgium).



Elad Schechter

A dancer, choreographer, curator and cultural initiator. Graduated from the Jerusalem High School for the Arts, and served in the IDF Theater department. Schechter was dancing in various dance companies, among them: Senedance NYC, the Kibbutz Contemporary Dance Company, Charleroi Danses (Brussels), Vertigo (Jerusalem). Elad served as rehearsal director to Noa Wertheim at the 'Vertigo Dance company' and to Sahar Azimi. In 2009 he founded and directed the Young Vertigo dance company in which he started creating dance pieces. In 2012 he founded the c.a.t.a.m.o.n Dance Group in Jerusalem. His works have been presented hundreds of times in Israel and abroad and have received the highest acclaims. Schechter is the recipient of the silver medal at the International Choreography Competition held in Beijing, July 2011.

Elad Schechter lives in the Nachlaot neighborhood in Jerusalem and raises his son and daughter in shared parenthood, with a woman couple.


